2. Academic Counselor- Raylene Robinson
  - **Odom-** Football had a winning season with 8 wins and 3 losses. Played in 1<sup>st</sup> round of playoffs. The team far exceeded expectations, for such a new team of athletics. Students are making strides towards common core standards in History (7-8<sup>th</sup> and U.S. History).
  - **Peters-** 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> Graders Literature is focused on reading "Romeo & Juliet." The 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> Graders Literature is reading "1984." Princeton High School students are learning implied themes in literature and the sub textual symbols derived in text. Mr. Peters is pleased with the

growth of students since the beginning of the school year. Students are engaged and enthusiastic about English classes.

- **Martinez-** FFA just had their “Harvest Dinner” fundraiser. Ag. Mechanic students built a table and chair set which sold at the Harvest Dinner for \$250. Students in Ag. Mechanics are building wooden flower boxes to take home. Ag. Mechanics student Joey (11<sup>th</sup> grade) built a BBQ Smoker. Welding/Manufacturing classes are excited to be working with the new welding equipment. Mr. Martinez is training to learn use of new Plasma torch. FFA students are volunteering to work at the Gridley Fairgrounds helping with the Camp Fire rescued large animals & cleaning stalls. Mr. Martinez helps provide transportation for students in the Princeton FFA dual cab truck. Freshman FFA students will soon be competing in a Sectional competition. Ag. Science classes - Congratulations to the classroom Chinchilla’s who just had babies. Students are learning about the life/growth cycle of animals and will sell the offspring to further fund the Ag. Department at Princeton.
- **Herniman-** Digital Media Art class received UC/CSU A-G approval which offers Princeton Students and additional class to use for Visual Performing Arts classification of towards UC/CSU Elective for college entrance. 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Elective class is learning drawing techniques of line paneling. Seniors learned a step by step painting a blue truck with assistance from Ms. Robinson. Digital Media Arts is learning “Photoshop” techniques. Spanish classes are working on a Family project - creating a Family Tree.
